



- Students are required to have a minimum CGPA of 2.0 and 80% attendance.
- ❖ A valid reason for being absent from class for three consecutive days must be provided to the Immigration.
- ❖ The Immigration reserves the right to cancel student passes if a student has poor attendance or academic results.
- ❖ Students pursuing a three year degree programme should not exceed more than four years to complete the programme while students who are pursuing a four year degree programme should not take more than five years to complete the programme.




The form (on the right) shows that a particular student has a CGPA of 1.64

Therefore, the student did not meet the requirements set by the Immigration. As such, his/her student visa was only renewed for <u>6 months</u> instead of 12 months

- ❖ If the CGPA of the student improves to a grade of 2.0, a one year student pass will be granted in the following renewal application.
- ❖ The same applies to the student's attendance.







❖ The form (on the right) shows that a particular student has been studying at UCSI for over four years.

Therefore, the student did not meet the requirements set by the Immigration. As such, the student visa was only renewed for <u>3</u> months instead of 12 months.





❖ The form (on the right) shows that a particular student has been studying at UCSI for five years.



Students who do not meet the requirements set by the Immigration will receive the 'FINAL' stamp on their student visa.

With this, the student will <u>no longer</u> be able to renew his/her student visa and continue with his/her studies. The student will need to return to his/her home country.

If the student wants to continue his/her study at UCSI, a new Visa Approval letter needs to be submitted.
